Bourne Estate and surrounding area Community Conversation Partnership Action Plan - December 2017

Introduction:

This Action Plan has been developed to inform the community what the Partnership is doing to address the concerns raised at our Community conversation on 14th December 2017.

We are looking at each issue of concern raised by the community and trying to understand them from the community's perspective so that we can seek to address them in a way that will meet your needs.

We will also work together with colleagues and Partners to find ways of improving the environment for example, pruning trees and bushes that can sometimes allow the opportunity for antisocial behaviour (ASB) to take place and in some cases will seek support from the community by way of asking you to report these issues when they occur. This will enable us to deal with the concerns quickly.

Some of the problems require longer-term solutions and we will continue to work with our partners and community members to look at ways of taking these forward, please let us know if you have any ideas in this regard.

Where there has been reports about individual cases of ASB/Crime officers the appropriate agency will investigate and work with and support the people involved and the community, making referrals to specialist agencies and exploring the use of legal interventions where necessary.

The Action Plan is a "live" and "working" document, which means that it will change and develop over time as circumstances change and new ideas are agreed. Please let us know the impact of the actions that have happened since the Community Conversation in December and if we need to do things differently. The community's feedback is very important going forward as we need to know what is working well and what needs to change to address current concerns or any other future concerns that may arise. We will organize a follow up Community Conversation to assist with this process.

You asked:

 What we are doing about the gang activity (Easy Cash) from Islington and other parts of Camden. This is an issue on the estate and the community are sometimes frightened to go out.

We are & will:

- There are currently joint patrols by Community Safety patrolling teams and the Police taking place in the area to help identify and engage with those that are possibly linked to this activity.
- The Detached Team from Youth Services are also present on the estate and engaging with as many young people as possible to divert them into positive activities.
- Where appropriate and possible enforcement action will be taken against individuals who continue to cause a concern and come to notice.
- The Council and the Police will gather intelligence/ evidence during their patrols in case we need use legal enforcement to stop the ASB/ Crime.

Since December 2017 a number of young people have been spoken by the Police and the Council about their behaviour in and around the estate. Some of these individuals have also been given warnings and their activity is being monitored by all agencies.

The joint patrols and work b the Detached Youth Team is continuing.
The Metropolitan Police and the Council organised a "Fu Day Event" for the residents of the Bourne Estate on Saturday 14 th July 2018. The event was attended by partner agencies, local businesses and emergency services. These services came together to share information and to reassure residents that they are all working together to tackle the ASB/ youth crime issues on the Bourne Estate.
Significant inroads have been made to the gang problem on the Bourne Estate, where a community weapons sweep has also been conducted on 01 February 2018.
Some arrests have been made in terms of perpetrators.
