Camden Gardens and Hawley Crescent – bus priority and pedestrian safety improvements

The Camden (Waiting and Loading Restrictions) (Amendment No. *) Traffic Order 202*

The Camden (Parking Places) (CA-F) (Amendment No. *) Traffic Order 202*

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Camden ('the Council') propose to make the above Orders under section 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general nature and effect of the Orders would be, in connection with the provision of kerb build-outs:
 - (a) in CAMDEN GARDENS, south-west side, to:-
 - (i) extend the 'at any time' waiting restrictions so that they extend from Kentish Town Road, eastwards for 25 metres; and
 - (ii) introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions between Kentish Town Road and a point 15 metres south-east of Kentish Town Road;
 - (b) in HAWLEY CRESCENT, north side, to:-
 - (i) remove the pay and display parking place located alongside The Elephant House, No. 35 Kentish Town Road; and
 - (ii) replace the existing waiting restrictions with 'at any time' waiting and loading restrictions extending from Kentish Town Road, westwards for 39 metres.
- 3. FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council, under section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, have approved the provision of a 'zebra' pedestrian crossing in Kentish Town Road, with its centre-line 9 metres southwest of the south-western kerb-line of Camden Gardens ('zig zag' markings on which stopping would be prohibited 'at any time' would extend 17 metres either side of the crossing).

Statement of reasons

Camden Gardens and Hawley Crescent – bus priority and pedestrian safety improvements

The Camden (Waiting and Loading Restrictions) (Amendment No. *) Traffic Order 202*

The Camden (Parking Places) (CA-F) (Amendment No. *) Traffic Order 202*

1 Project background

- 1.1 The Camden Town Area Bus Priority and Pedestrian Safety Improvements scheme consisted of measures to improve bus journey times and reliability on Parkway and Kentish Town Road, and to support walking and cycling.
- 1.2 This Statement of Reasons sets out the reasons for a number of proposed measures and associated reasons for these changes.

2 Summary of changes and reasoning

- 2.1 Transport for London has identified Parkway, between Gloucester Avenue and Arlington Road, and the southern section of Kentish Town Road, between Camden High Street (Britannia Junction) and Camden Gardens, as streets that would benefit from amendments to help protect and improve bus journey times and reliability. In response to feedback and the full public consultation held during February and March 2024, the following changes are proposed.
- 2.4 The following permanent changes are proposed on Kentish Town Road (between Britannia Junction and Camden Gardens) and Hawley Crescent, under a Traffic Management Order (TMO):
 - (i) Amend the traffic lanes on Kentish Town Road at the junction with Hawley Crescent to allow left turns only to Hawley Crescent from the nearside lane and straight and right turns only from the offside lane for all vehicles. This is to correct the marking on the ground as there are more vehicles turning left onto Hawley Crescent than right into Sainsbury's car park.
 - (ii) Introduce signalised pedestrian crossings with countdown timers on all arms, at the junction of Hawley Crescent and Kentish Town Road, to improve pedestrian safety and accessibility.
 - (iii) Extend the pavement on the north side of Hawley Crescent to improve pedestrian comfort. This would require the removal of 4 paid for parking bays.
 - (iv) Introduce a new zebra crossing on Kentish Town Road, south of the junction with Camden Gardens, including a footway buildout to improve visibility. This would require replacing single yellow line on Camden

Gardens, with double yellow lines with double kerb markings (no parking/waiting at any time).

- 2.5 These proposals, if approved, would:
 - (i) Create circa 279 metres of new bus lane which would help protect and improve bus journey times and reliability.
 - (ii) Support safer and healthier streets in the area especially for pedestrians and cyclists.
 - (iii) Maintain loading and unloading facilities for businesses on Parkway and Kentish Town Road.

3 Reasons for Proposing to Make the Orders

- 3.1 The proposed changes have been developed in response to the identification of streets that would benefit from measures to help protect and improve bus journey times and reliability. As outlined in Transport for London's (TfL) LB Camden Healthy Streets Data Pack Spring 2024, Parkway and the southern section of Kentish Town Road have 'very poor' and 'poor' bus speeds and variability respectively. Furthermore, these proposals contribute to and align with the Council's policy vision set out in:
 - We Make Camden
 - Camden's Transport Strategy and supporting action plans
 - Mayor's Transport Strategy
 - Transport for London's Bus Action Plan
 - Camden's Climate Action Plan
 - Camden's Clean Air Action Plan

(This Note is not part of the Order)

As part of the Camden Town Area Bus Priority and Pedestrian Safety Improvements, this Order amends the provisions of the Camden (Waiting and Loading Restrictions) Traffic Order 2012, so as to: introduce a length of no waiting 'at any time' replacing a pay and display parking place on Hawley Crescent and introduce no loading 'at any time' restrictions along this stretch and up to and including the eastern kerb-line of the vehicular access to the off-street parking place adjacent to Nos. 17-29 Hawley Crescent; and extend the 'at any time' waiting restriction on Camden Gardens between Kentish Town Road to the south-eastern kerb-line of the vehicular access to the off-street parking area located between Nos. 43-46 and 53-55 Camden Gardens and introduce no loading 'at any time' restrictions along the westernmost 15 metres of this stretch, in the London Borough of Camden.
