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

- Independent facilitation and evaluation from Involve and University College London.





Assembly proposals to full Council


- Assembly members presented proposals to full Council on 7 October.
- Council agrees to adopt the Assembly proposals and develop a new Climate Action Plan for Camden.
- Council agrees Motion to target a zero carbon Camden by 2030.

Council operations

Climate Emergency scrutiny panel

Greening the Council's operations

All council properties to be fossil-fuel free

Action plan proposals

- 1. Commit to a net zero carbon Camden by 2030
- 2. Develop a strategy for all council buildings to be fossil-fuel free by 2030
- 3. Make 5 Pancras Square plastic free by 2020 and all other sites plastic free by 2021
- 4. Switch the Council's corporate estate to green electricity and create a green energy offer for schools and housing
- 5. Install renewable energy systems on all feasible council buildings
- 6. Make Camden's fleet low/zero emission by 2022
- 7. Switch all street lighting to 100% LED by 2023
- 8. Establish a new community led Climate Action
 Design Board to oversee "innovation lab" work on
 climate programmes
- 9. Ensure all major contracts are evaluated from a carbon and climate perspective.
- 10. Lead a London Councils climate programme to agree a London wide lobbying position to Government on the climate crisis

Fitting solar panels on as many homes as possible


Piloting a community energy heating scheme

Action plan proposals

- Identify a community heating pilot project (heat pump district heating) with Power up North London
- 2. Hold a retrofit conference for residents and community groups
- 3. Design a new retrofit policy and programme for Camden through the "Inclusive Innovation Network"
- 4. Deliver a bulk-buying scheme over 2019/20 to make solar panels cheaper Solar Together
- 5. Develop a large scale solar project across the Camden estate
- 6. Expand and promote the Camden Climate Fund to fund solar projects
- 7. Promote Retrofit Together (late 2019 launch)
 - GLA retrofit procurement scheme

Aim and Objectives

The aim of this work is for Camden residents, communities and businesses to shape the next Climate Action Plan (CAP). This will be done through the following objectives:

- Establishing a golden thread from the Citizens' Assembly recommendations 5 years ago through to the new Plan.
- Incorporating insights from the missing voices of the Assembly and previous CAP (business community; youth; those experiencing / vulnerable to climate impacts)
- Giving a greater focus to climate resilience through a climate justice narrative throughout

 ultimately to embed climate resilience / climate justice at the CAP's centre.
- Providing transparency on the Council's successes and progress, whilst addressing the challenges of finance.
- Taking a place-based approach to co-design / engagement and is rooted in the ambitions
 of We Make Camden (addressing the wider issues of the communities of Camden.



3 Stage Engagement Approach

- 1. Place-based engagement activities targeted engagement to gather current priorities, ideas and insights;
- 2. Resident and community group focused "Climate Action Plan Community" event reconvening original Assembly members, with new voices, to refresh the Assembly recommendations celebrating the CAP achievements and weighing up what comes next;
- 3. A business-focused summit a space for the local economy to join the journey and be posed the We Make Camden Challenge "What will the local economy do to tackle the climate emergency"
